An Historic Pre-assassination Timeline Continued...

November 18, 1963: Assassination plan in Miami. Four days before he was assassinated President Kennedy was in Miami to address the International Press Association. The Miami police had discovered a plot to assassinate Kennedy. The police informed the Secret Service of the plot. **The Miami police cancelled the motorcade in Miami and transported Kennedy by helicopter** to the meeting. The assassination plot now moves from Miami to Dallas. (See November 1963: CIA operative Marita Lorenz)

U.S. Senate Investigator, former OSS officer during World War Two and U.S. State Department intelligence analyst Harold Weisberg (1913-2002) reported, “The second known threat... was made not in Miami, where the assassination conspiracy did not succeed, but in Dallas, where it did. It was made before there was public announcement that the President would go to Dallas. It was made by exile, anti-Castro Cubans, exactly those groups involved in the New Orleans aspects **suppressed by the [Warren] Commission** and reported in [the classified file] ‘Oswald in New Orleans.’ It was made in public. A tape recording of it exists!”

November 19, 1963: Two Dallas newspapers publish the presidential motorcade route. It did not show the route detouring off Main Street and turning onto Elm Street. Clearly that detour was held as “inside information.” Only on Friday morning November 22 did any of the Texas School Book Depository employees learn that the motorcade would pass by their building. A “lone gunman” employed in that building would not have had enough time to plan an attempted assassination of the president.

Also on November 19, 1963 CIA Deputy Director of Plans Richard Helms went into the Oval Office at the White House with a large canvas bag reporting to the President that he had something to show him. Helms reached into the bag and took out a sub-machinegun! Helms told Kennedy that it was from a stash of weapons intercepted by the CIA on the way to Venezuela from Cuba. Shocked that Helms was able to smuggle a sub-machinegun past the Secret Service into the Oval Office, Kennedy tried to make a joke out of it. “It gives me a feeling of confidence.” The CIA had made their point – they could take out anyone anywhere.

Helms by this time had been involved with or overseen numerous political murders; Kennedy would simply become the next in a continuing line of assassinations.

Earlier, President Kennedy had asked the CIA Director which agent they had who most reflected the fictional background and capabilities of Ian Fleming’s agent 007 James Bond. The spy master sent over CIA Agent William Harvey who met Kennedy in the Oval Office. The man who would soon, very soon be directly involved with Kennedy’s murder was asked by the President if the heavy-drinking Harvey had “as much luck with women as James Bond.” Reportedly Harvey gave a vague answer and later referred to Kennedy as a “fag.”

November 19, 1963: From State Department records, a man entered the United States on this day named Michel Roux (an alias used by French soldier of fortune Jean Souetre).

November 20, 1963: Melba Christine Marcades reported to police in Louisiana on November 20, 1963 that a plot was made to kill Kennedy in Dallas in two days, and reported that Jack Ruby was involved in the plot. **She had worked as a stripper for Ruby in a Dallas night club.** After the

Kennedy murder she reported that she had often seen Ruby and Oswald together at his club in Dallas. It has been clearly established that Jack Ruby knew Oswald and had met with him on several occasions. **Marcades was murdered on September 4, 1965. Shot in the back of the head and made to look like a hit and run traffic accident. Body found on property of the Chief of security for Texas billionaire oilman H. L. Hunt. (1889-1974) Autopsy is missing.**

November 20, 1963: President Kennedy announces that he has ordered the withdrawal of some 1000 combat ‘advisors’ from Vietnam.

Late November 1963: Only days before the assassination Oswald “delivered a secret note to [FBI] agent James Hosty at its Dallas office.” The FBI admitted during the 1975 Church Senate Committee investigation into the CIA that the note was delivered and that Hosty “ripped it up and flushed it down the toilet AFTER the assassination.” As a paid informant the note could not have been a demand for the FBI to stop harassing Oswald as he was on the payroll even though the FBI stated that this was the contents of the note. Is it not a more likely scenario that the note warned the FBI of the local plot to murder President Kennedy by one of the FBI’s operatives and the FBI simply ignored it?

November 20/21, 1963: Oswald was seen with Officer J. D. Tippit (1924-1963). Oswald had made several early morning trips to the Dobbs House Restaurant before going to work at the Texas School Book Depository so he was known to the employees. On November 20 or 21, 1963 waitresses Mary Dowling and Dolores Harrison saw him at the restaurant and took his order. Mary Dowling later reported that Officer J. D. Tippit was at the restaurant at the same time and “took note of Oswald”.

“Wanted For Treason” poster in Dallas – November 21, 1963



Hundreds of these posters were displayed along the Dallas motorcade route. These were published by Robert Surrey a friend of FBI Agent James P. Hosty and funded by oil millionaire H. L. Hunt.

“JFK-Wanted for Treason” ads in newspapers – November 22, 1963

Bernard William Weissman placed “JFK-Wanted for Treason” ads in Dallas newspapers for November 22, 1963. Two weeks before the assassination Weissman had been in Jack Ruby’s Carrousel Club with Ruby and Police Officer J. D. (Jefferson Davis) Tippit. Several witnesses verified the meeting.

It was clear that the hatred for President Kennedy by certain groups was very strong in Dallas; so much so that Dallas Chief of Police Jesse Curry went on T.V. to call for calm and for no overt actions be taken by the general public against the president. Kennedy and his Secret Service detail understood that he was heading into very dangerous territory and would do so in an exposed limousine!

Secret Internal CIA Memorandum – 1966

CIA operative Lieutenant colonel William Raymond Corson (1926-2000): “*Someday we will have to explain [E. Howard] Hunt’s presence in Dallas on November 22, 1963 - the day President Kennedy was killed. Hunt is going to be hard put to explain this memo, and other things, before the TV cameras at the HSCA hearings.*”

DATA POINT: From 1949 to 1970, E. Howard Hunt served as an officer in the Central Intelligence Agency. After Hunt’s death, Howard St. John Hunt and David Hunt stated that their father had recorded several claims about himself and others being involved in a conspiracy to assassinate President John F. Kennedy. Notes and audio recordings were made. In the April 5, 2007, issue of *Rolling Stone*, St. John Hunt detailed a number of individuals purported to be implicated by his father, including **Lyndon B. Johnson, CIA Agent Cord Meyer, CIA Agent David Atlee Phillips, CIA Agent Frank Sturgis, Miami CIA head David Sanchez Morales, CIA operative Antonio Veciana Blanch, CIA Agent William K. Harvey**, and an assassin he termed “French gunman Grassy Knoll.” As above in the Rome intercept William K. Harvey is once again identified as being part of a plot to assassinate President Kennedy. Hunt would serve as the paymaster for the operation.

DATA POINT: Frank Sturgis worked as an undercover operative for the Central Intelligence Agency. He was named as one of the men who along with Miami CIA head David Morales met with E. Howard Hunt shortly before the assassination of John F. Kennedy.

DATA POINT: Mary Pinchot Meyer (1920-1964), was married to CIA Agent Cord Meyer from 1945-1958, and she became involved romantically with President John F. Kennedy after her divorce from Meyer. **Mary Meyer was shot to death on the Chesapeake & Ohio Canal towpath on October 12, 1964, three weeks after the release of the Warren Commission Report, whose conclusions Meyer challenged. Her diary was removed by the CIA.**

Meeting on the evening – November 21, 1963

On the evening of November 21, 1963 a meeting/party was held in the home of Clint Murchison, Sr. in Dallas, Texas. Murchison was a close friend of David Harold Byrd who owned the Texas School Book Depository. Byrd was a member of the right-wing Texas Crusade for Freedom along with Dallas Mayor Earle Cabell. Present were Vice President Lyndon B. **Johnson** and Johnson’s long term girlfriend Madelyn Duncan Brown (1925-2002) (they had a son together, Steven Mark Brown, which has been verified by letters from Johnson’s attorneys, **the son would die mysteriously**), former Vice President Richard M. **Nixon**, FBI Director J. Edgar **Hoover**, John J. **McCloy** (1895-1989), former President of the World Bank and future member of the Warren Commission, Texas oil billionaire H. L. **Hunt** (Haroldson Lafayette Hunt, Jr., and Gotfried Mequon. Hunt was reportedly on friendly terms with de Monrenschildt who had ‘befriended’ Lee Harvey Oswald.

The meeting was reported by Madelyn Brown and verified by an FBI document released under the Freedom of Information Act in 1978 during The United States House of Representatives Select Committee on Assassinations hearings. John J. McCloy is quoted as stating at the meeting, **“After tomorrow we won’t have to worry about the Kennedy’s anymore.” “After tomorrow, those goddamn Kennedys will never embarrass me again. That’s no threat. That’s a promise.”**


DATA POINT: John Jay McCloy , Chairman of Chase Manhattan Bank and former President of the World Bank did not want the United States government to issue U.S. Bank Notes which would have cost the private banks hundreds of billions of dollars. Kennedy had ordered the change and five billion dollars were printed in October 1963 to begin the process of changing the money away from the privately owned Federal Reserve to U.S. Bank Notes. John J. McCloy had backed the coup d’état operation, and would later serve on the Warren Commission along with his old friend former CIA Director Allen Dulles (1893-1969). **After Kennedy’s murder Johnson reversed the order within days of taking over the office. McCloy was presented with the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Lyndon B. Johnson on December 6, 1963, 14 days after the assassination!**

DATA POINT: H. L. Hunt was the man responsible for publishing JFK wanted posters in Dallas days before the assassination (see above). When he was warned about this activity he remarked, “I’m the richest man in the world and I never get in trouble.”

DATA POINT: Madelyn Brown would later state that Johnson had told her during January of 1964 that the assassination was financed by Texas oil men and carried out by elements of the CIA.

DATA POINTS: Johnson and Hoover were very good friends who lived across the street from each other in Washington, D.C. for nearly 18 years. Johnson’s favorite hit-man was Mac Wallace.

After the meeting in Dallas Hoover flew back to Washington that night, Johnson stayed overnight with his girlfriend in Dallas and met his wife, who had flown in on Air Force One with the President, at Love Field to greet Kennedy the next morning. Nixon would state that, unlike most Americans, he could not recall where he was on the day before Kennedy was assassinated!

Historian Walt Brown wrote, “The [Kennedy] assassination would not have been carried out if those behind it did not have the **FULL** acquiescence of the incoming President [**Johnson**] and the FBI Director [**Hoover**].” History would show that the only way Johnson could get into the Oval Office was to shoot his way in. History also shows that it was Johnson who pressed hard for Kennedy to visit Dallas, reportedly to patch up differences in the Democratic Party in Texas.

FBI report – November 22, 1963

“Advised that GEORGE H. W. BUSH, a respectable businessman, furnished information to the effect that JAMES PARROTT has been talking of killing the President when he comes to Houston... The agency has a report that PARROTT stated in 1961 he would kill President KENNEDY if he got near him.”

(This was the 4th reported warning of a possible assassination plot on Kennedy during the time frame of his planned trip to Texas.)

DATA POINT: Future President George H. W. Bush had close contacts with the CIA for many years and was Director of the CIA from 1975 to 1976. As above, the ships used to ferry Cuban exile troops to the beaches at the Bay of Pigs were owned by George H. W. Bush. In fact Bush began working for the CIA in 1960 or 61 using his oil operations as cover for clandestine activities. Bush later remarked, “I was in Houston, Texas at the time [of the assassination] and involved in the oil drilling business.” **After the assassination Bush was briefed on the assassination as an agent for the CIA.**

Ad in the *Dallas Morning News*, November 22, 1963

“Welcome Mr. Kennedy to Dallas.” It reported that Kennedy had, “scrapped the Monroe Doctrine in favor of the Spirit of Moscow” and that Kennedy had gone “soft on Communists.”

Conclusions:

- 1. President John F. Kennedy was set up for assassination in Dallas, Texas after earlier failed attempts by a small group from the Central Intelligence Agency with support by individuals within and outside of the government of the United States.***
- 2. This was an inside American political coup d'état, which placed Johnson in power.***
- 3. Lee Harvey Oswald was an American intelligence operative.***

“What can Mr. Warren have had in mind when he uttered those resonant words a month ago, that in our lifetime we shall not know some of the things the Commission has learned about the assassination?”
