

# The Assassin

Jean Rene Marie Souetre



This is an image of CIA contract killer Jean Souetre firing from the Grassy Knoll;  
**the man who murdered President John F. Kennedy!**

The enlarged computer enhanced image of the “badge man” shows that he wore a Dallas Police uniform with badge and patch; was right handed; parted his hair on the left side; was between 25 to 35 years old; wore glasses, at least at the time he shot President Kennedy, and WAS NOT LEE HARVEY OSWALD who was drinking a soft drink at the time inside the Texas School Book Depository! It is also quite clear that the “badge man” was firing a rifle at the time, (the flash clearly visible in front of his face) which eliminates the single gun myth once and for all!

Jean Rene Marie Souetre was a French soldier and sniper. At times he used the alias Michel Roux. Immigration records indicate that a man using the name Michel Roux entered the United States on November 19, 1963.

In a classified CIA document released in 1977 it is reported that he was “in Dallas on Friday, November 22, 1963.” According to the document some 18 hours after the Kennedy assassination a French suspect was arrested in Fort Worth, Texas, which noted “the subject is suspected of being a deserter captain of the French army and militant of the OAS.” **There is a further report that an individual named Souetre was arrested in Dallas on November 22, 1963** and was soon “expellant” from the United States.

The question must be asked: Why would police or other officials release and expel a known French sniper who had been arrested in Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963?

## Lee Harvey Oswald

“I emphatically deny these charges.”

“I didn’t shoot anybody!”

### THE EVIDENCE FOR THE DEFENSE

- o Oswald adamantly denied any involvement in the murders of Kennedy or Tippit
- o Psychological stress test shows Oswald to be truthful in his responses; (“I’m a patsy!”)
- o Oswald was working as a CIA operative while in Dallas, Texas (i.e. secret government employee)
- o The “reported” assassination rifle cannot be linked to Oswald, only to an intelligence alias
- o Direct and overwhelming evidence that the CIA was responsible for the Kennedy murder
- o A fake Oswald in Mexico points directly to frame-up of Oswald by elements of the U.S. Gov.
- o Cover-up of medical evidence points to a frame-up of Oswald by elements of the U.S. Gov.
- o Original medical evidence proves that at least two riflemen were shooting at the President
- o Best FBI marksman could not duplicate the reported three rifle shots.
- o Bolt on the “reported” assassination weapon stuck, and was difficult to operate
- o The “reported” assassination weapon was poorly sighted and inaccurate
- o Oswald’s proven poor marksmanship with a rifle precludes his firing with accuracy
- o So-called “Magic Bullet” did not match any rifle and had no biological material present
- o Dozens of witnesses were murdered to uphold the U.S. Government cover-up
- o Oswald could not have known when the motorcade would drive past the TSBD
- o No one saw Oswald bring any weapon into the Texas School Book Depository
- o Witnesses reported that Oswald did not bring anything into the TSBD on Nov. 22, 1963

- o No one saw Oswald fire a weapon at the motorcade
- o No witness can place Oswald on the 6<sup>th</sup> floor during the assassination
- o Witnesses place Oswald on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floors just before and after the assassination
- o No Oswald finger prints found anywhere around the so-called “sniper’s nest”
- o No Oswald finger prints found on the so-called assassination rifle
- o No evidence that Oswald fired a rifle on November 22, 1963
- o Faked backyard photos of “Oswald” with a rifle points directly to a frame-up of Oswald
- o Three rifles were located at the TSBD; none directly linked to Lee Harvey Oswald
- o Government doctored photographic evidence of the assassination shows cover-up
- o Government doctored medical evidence of the assassination shows cover-up
- o Missing photographic evidence of the assassination shows cover-up
- o Continuing cover-up of assassination documents which would prove Oswald’s innocence
- o The alteration of the Dealey Plaza crime scene shows cover-up by the U.S. Government
- o Acoustical evidence clearly shows two gunman fired at the President
- o No fewer than 51 witnesses report shots fired from Grassy Knoll
- o Testimony of Governor Connally indicates two gunmen firing at motorcade
- o Oswald revolver was non-functional
- o Oswald revolver was not matched to the bullets or Tippit murder
- o Witnesses testified that two men were involved in Tippit murder
- o Oswald cannot be placed at the Tippit murder scene
- o Finally: Lee Harvey Oswald was murdered to prevent him testifying in open court
